3-way Interviews in week 10

By now you should have gone online and booked your 3-way interview time with your child's teacher. 3-way interviews are exactly that; a three-way discussion with you, your child and your child's teacher(s) and specialty teachers. It's a chance to talk about how your child is settled into the routine of school, their academic and social progress, areas in which your child is making good progress and potentially where they could improve. Importantly, it's a chance to hear the voice of your child as they share a large part of the responsibility for their learning. If for some reason you do not yet have a booking time, please contact your child's teacher ASAP to arrange a time, as we expect all students to have the opportunity to participate in a 3-way interview.

Enrolling in 2018- Capacity Management Plan update

Mawson Lakes School is under extreme enrolment pressure. It is a zoned school and you need to be living in the school zone to be considered for enrolment. Due to continuing enrolment pressures, and to enable priority access for families who live in school zone, Mawson Lakes School will be under a DECD Capacity Management Plan once again in 2017/18

If your child is starting school in reception next year and you are living in the zone you may express your interest in registering for enrolment in 2018, by filling out the appropriate paperwork through the front office.

At the moment the school is awaiting the new Capacity Management Plan from DECD to confirm the exact number of students we can enrol for 2018. It is our understanding that the enrolment number for Reception students in 2018 will be increased on the numbers we were able to enrol in 2017.

Maths Strategies for Parents


Subitising

When you look at a small group of objects, you may not need to count all; you just know how many are there.


Deriving its meaning from the Latin word subito = sudden, subitising is the strategy of not counting a group but relying on your intuition to know how many objects the group contains. As you look at the group, you suddenly know how many objects it contains.

For example, which of these groups can you subitise, and which would-you prefer to count?

How many objects in each group?









There are fewer stars than triangles, but because the stars are not displayed in a pattern, you may need to count them all to be sure that there are 8 of them.

After subitising, we usually retain a clear image of the arrangement of the objects. For example, you would find it easy to describe the group of 5 as 'four at the corners of a square and one in the middle'. It would be much harder to give an accurate description of the group of 8 stars.

With Your Child

Subitising is known to be fundamental to understanding number, and you can help your child by showing them regular arrangements of objects to subitise – M&Ms work well for this, as they are colourful, easy to see at a glance and yummy. The standard arrangements are those we see on the face of dice, and these make a good starting point.













Perception psychologists suggest that all people can subitise between 5 and 9 objects, referring to the magic number 7 plus or minus 2. So only work with single digit numbers when showing groups to your child.

Number counting books can also be used to discuss which groupings can be subitised and which need to be counted.





