It was fantastic to hear the students describe their learning successes and term highlights! We will be continuing our focus on developing independent learners who take initiative within their learning and make positive behavioural choices. This was evident in those students who attended camp and challenged themselves with being independent and trying things outside their comfort zone. This term we would like students to increase their flexibility when working. They can choose certain learning zones that suit themselves as a learner, per task.

MATHEMATICS

Within mathematics this term, we will be investigating the relationship between fractions, decimals and percentages as representations of the same number. Students will be developing their proportional reasoning skills within fractions, determining fractions of other quantities, and connecting fractions to measurement concepts. Within problem solving and mental routines students will be utilising mental computation strategies and developing their use of empty number lines to assist calculations.

ENGLISH

This term we will be focusing on our persuasive skills, in both written and spoken forms. We will be focusing on writing powerful expositions by developing our language, vocabulary and reasoning skills. We will also be developing our oral presentation skills by class discussions, persuasive battles and planning and delivering formal presentations. During reading, we will be developing our History knowledge through our class text and continuing our group and individual reading programs.

HISTORY

In History we will be contending, why is Australia a desirable location for immigration? We will learn about Immigration, Australian human rights and influential people through time. Students will develop their interviewing, letter writing and oral presentation skills.

SCIENCE

This term in Science, students will be exploring the physical and chemical changes in everyday materials through investigations. Students will further develop an understanding of changes such as melting, evaporating, dissolving, reacting and burning.
