Classes: W3-1 and W3-2

Welcome to back to term two.

It is great to see our students back in the classroom, behind their desks and focused on their work. Term two is always a busy term where students further their studies, are introduced to new topics, ask and solve questions, and set themselves new goals. During the term, W3-1 and W3-2 will work together and for plan coming events.

Mathematics

We will continue to develop our understanding of number and algebra, and problem solving. Both classes will introduce learning with fractions (simplifying, addition and subtraction), decimals and move on to percentage.

English

Our focus is persuasive and recount text types. In writing lessons we will have specialist teacher, Michelle to support EALD students. In guided reading lessons our focus is to strengthen students reading comprehension, vocabulary and fluency by reading a selection of non-fiction and fiction texts, and work in reading groups and individually.

Science

In Science, our classes will study Earth and Space. We will research geological changes within the world and major disasters that have affected the world.

Humanities and Social Sciences

We will continue to research Australian History and Geography. In History, students will explore the events and ideas which lead to Australia's Federation and Constitution. In Geography, students will continue to research, collect data, use maps and explore Australia and an Asian neighbour, making connections between the countries.

Child Protection Curriculum (CPC)

Our classes will be looking at 'The Right To Be Safe'. Our lessons will focus on safety and risk taking and early warning signs. In these lessons students have the chance to talk openly in a range of activities within a safe classroom environment.
