English

We will continue to focus on Jolly Grammar and the spelling program it offers, expanding our vocabulary in a variety of areas and topic. We will also continue to develop our skills in other aspects of writing such as grammar, punctuation and handwriting.

Our writing focus for the term will be poetry and expositions in advertising.

We will continue to incorporate some oral language into our weekly program to provide students with opportunities to express their thoughts and ideas about their learning as well as presenting work to the class.

Guided Reading will continue to be a part of our daily program where the students will focus on developing their comprehension skills. As a school our main focus is on inferring and reflecting on texts.

Maths

Number and time will remain a regular part of our weekly program and will intertwine with the other strands and sub strands.

Fractions, measurement, shape and angles will be the focus for the term.

W11 and W12 Term Overview

Science

In Science we will be moving on to chemical sciences. The students will be learning that natural and processed materials have a range of physical properties that can influence their use. The students will apply the observable properties of materials to explain how objects and materials can be used.

Technology

The focus this term will be digital technologies. The students will identify and explore a range of digital systems with peripheral devices for different purposes, and transmit different types of data. They will recognise different types of data and explore how the same data can be represented in different ways.

CPC

We will continue to develop the students' understanding, recognising reporting abuse, then move on to protective strategies.

The students will continue to have these lessons throughout the term.
