Welcome to Term 4, hope you all had a relaxing holiday. I am looking forward to a successful term of learning.

English

Students will continue to focus on Jolly Grammar Spelling, expanding our vocabulary and accuracy. After terrific success last term, we are continuing our spelling groups in which targets students individual learning needs.

Our writing focus for the term will be on exploring narrative through novels and film. students listen to, read and view films and novels with a range of characters and themes that invite readers to explore real world social and moral issues.

Oral language is included in our weekly program to provide students with opportunities to express their thoughts and ideas about their learning as well as presenting work to the class. This will be through dialogic discussions and daily maths chats.

Guided Reading will be a part of our daily program where the students will focus on developing their reading and comprehension skills. Make sure to spend some time reading at home with your children and try to discuss and deconstruct the texts. This will really support us in building excellent reading comprehension skills and fluency when reading out loud.

Mathematics

This term students will be continuing with Number and Place value and this will include; understanding of multiplication / division problems, creative thinking to develop their estimation skills and use this to check the reasonableness of answers. We will also be having a look at shape, location and transformation which will provide a hands on approach to Mathematics. Daily mathematical chats will continue and be an opportunity for students to revisit all areas of the curriculum, to build student fluency and understanding.

HASS

This term the focus will be continuing business and economics, which focuses on the importance of needs and wants. Students are investigating the economic and business skills used when solving everyday problems and consider their own decision-making processes as a consumer. We will also be looking at civics and citizenship in which we explore the importance of being an active citizen within a community.

Science
