

LITERACY

ORAL LANGUAGE

- -Explicitly teaching interactive skills
- -Sharing (topic based)



PHONICS/SPELLING

- -Heggerty 'phonemic awareness' program; orally blending, segmenting, isolating, deleting, adding and substituting phonemes (sounds)
- -Revising Sounds: oo, oi/oy, ou/ow, or/au/aw/al, ar, er/ir/ur
- -Introducing Sounds: soft g/c, ph, silen k, ie, ey, eigh, ore, air, ear, ou/o, wa

READING

- -Take home readers will continue to be sent home weekly
- -Reading comprehension; literal and inferred meaning
- -Reading 72 Jolly Phonics Tricky Words (Yr 2)

WRITING

- -identifying, analysing and creating exposition and explanation texts
- -Writing 72 Tricky Words (Yr 2)
- -Jolly Grammar- punctuation, compound sentences, evaluative language, modal verbs

NUMERACY

ADDITION AND SUBRACTION

-Addition facts to 20, utilising strategies such as doubles, near doubles, counting on, combinations to 10 and bridging to 10.

Applying this knowledge to related subtraction facts.





FRACTIONS AND TIME

- identify common uses and represent halves, quarters and eighths in relation to shapes, objects and events
- -identify the date and determine the number of days between events using calendars
- -recognise and read the time represented on an analog clock to the hour, half-hour and quarter-hour





SCIENCE

Physical Science

Exploring different actions to make sounds. Recognising that sound energy causes objects to vibrate.



(Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths)

We will be integrating STEM throughout all aspects of the curriculum this term. Digital Technologies will be integrated across all learning areas of the curriculum to enhance student learning.

CHILD PROTECTION CURRICULUM

Students will continue to learn to identify warning signs and understand the right to be safe. They will learn about identifying their feelings, skills to engage in a range of social settings, safe and unsafe situations and risk taking.

GEOGRAPHY
